



# Project Update

## BELLEVUE 600 | SEPTEMBER 2021

### ACTIVITY

In September, the following work will be in-progress at the Bellevue 600 project:

- Mass excavation activities are currently underway and will continue through February 2022. Trucks are running Monday through Saturday.
- Northbound and southbound traffic lanes are now open to vehicles on 110th Avenue NE.
- On Saturday, Sept. 18, crews will be staging the conveyor equipment in the Cloudivue lot to the north of the fence. This activity will not impact the parking lot.
- On 108th Avenue NE, crews will conduct potholing activities in the right-of-way, which will affect sidewalk and traffic lanes periodically.
- Starting in mid September, utility relocation work will start on 108th Avenue NE. This activity will continue through October and include sidewalk closures on the east side of the street and temporarily remove the turn lane and bike lane. Access to Bellevue Corporate Plaza parking lot will be restricted to one lane at times and the northbound lane will be closed through mid October. The southbound turn lane will be temporarily converted into a northbound traffic lane.

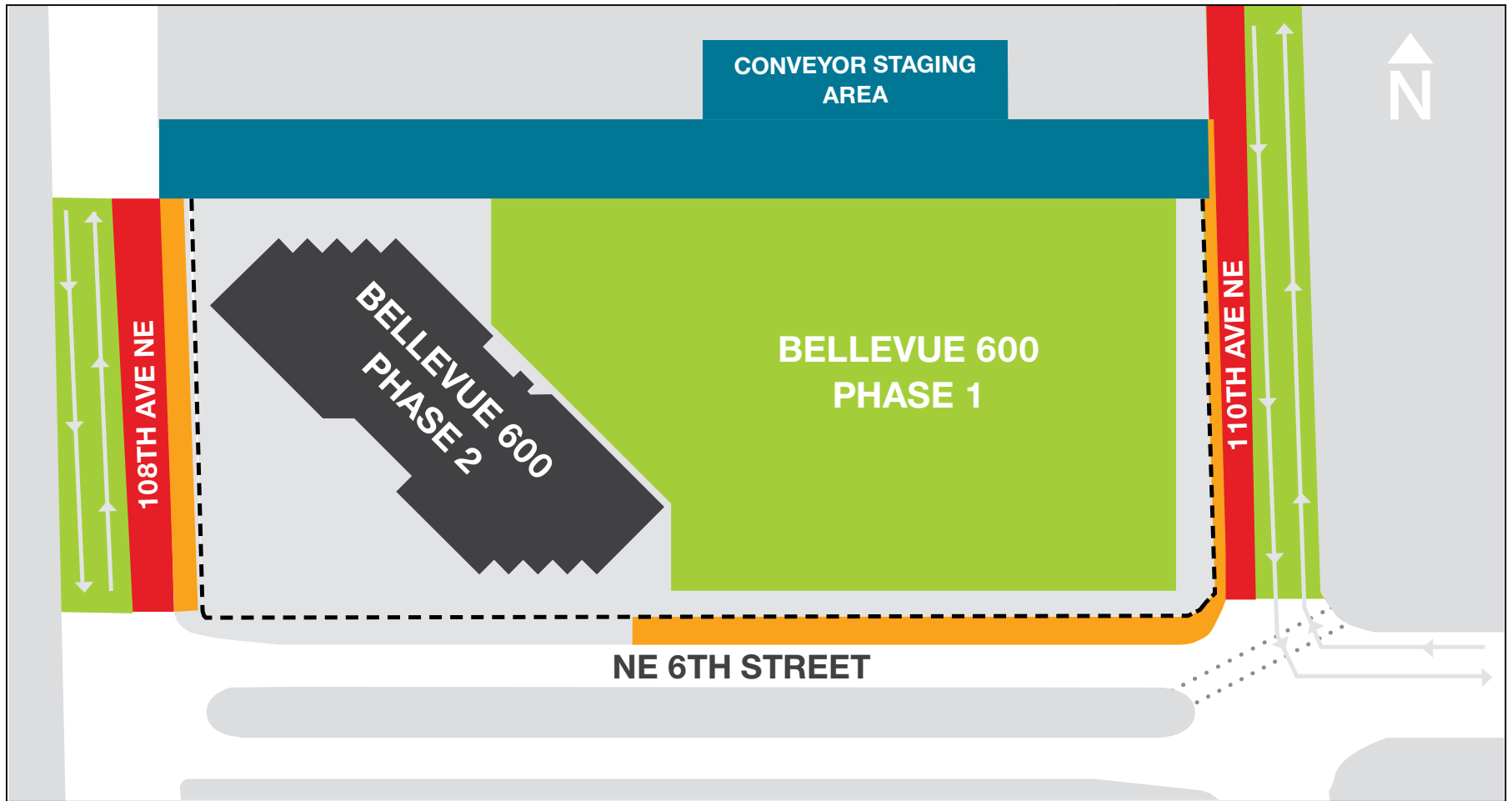

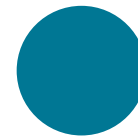
## BELLEVUE 600 MAP: SEPTEMBER 2021



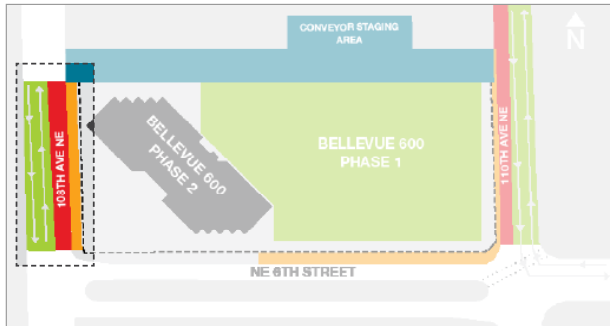
Sidewalk Closed

**Daily 108th Avenue NE Lane Closures & Turn Restrictions Continuing Through October**

- Franchise utility relocation work will start on 108th with an anticipated completion at the end of October.
- This work will result in sidewalk closures on the east side of the street, and the elimination of the turn lane and bike lane.
- Access to Bellevue Corporate Plaza parking lot will be restricted to one lane at times.
- During this work, a flagger will help direct vehicles entering and exiting the parking lot.
